Bamako: Launching ceremony of the Project to fight against growing insecurity, youth unemployment through their occupations through income-generating activities held on Wednesday, March 22, 2023 at the Maison de la femme Commune III of Bamako, after 3 months the presentation of the certificates took place on Friday, July 07, 2023



of Commune III of the District of Bamako, the Malian Institute for Research Action for Peace (IMRAP) in partnership with INTERPEACE, is launching the training project "to fight against growing insecurity, youth unemployment through their occupations through income-generating activities"

With a provisional budget of more than **3,665,500 CFA francs**, (three million six hundred and sixty-five thousand five hundred CFA francs), More than: One hundred (100) young people from Commune III, including five (05) young people per district, will be trained, young people (**in school, out of school and out of school)** from Commune III of the District of Bamako to facilitate their socioeconomic and professional integration in order to keep them busy and limit abuses, consequently reduce insecurity, juvenile delinquency and banditry within the commune and beyond.

Malians consulted by IMRAP/INTERPEACE agreed, in a consensual manner, that the immediate priority should be to put an end to chronic insecurity by re-establishing collaboration between the population and the defence and security forces.
